A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

No More Catechism in the Coat Closet

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,



In August, we will once again welcome back over 400 young Catholics, members of our parish families, to learn about our faith through our religious education program. Unfortunately, after extensive research, we have realized that we don't have enough space for them. In fact, we haven't had quite enough space for comfort for about eight years now.

In the past, we have tried many different possible solutions. We have shared classrooms, used temporary partitions, and kept some families at church all day by splitting classes into various times. We have even held a class or two in the coat closets off the Gathering Space! Understandably, all of these solutions led to unnecessary distractions, difficulty learning, and sometimes very poor attendance.

The Pastoral Council, together with the Finance Council, the Facilities Committee, the Religious Education staff, and myself, have seriously and prayerfully considered our options, and we have been led to two conclusions: the need for a Master Plan for the coming years of our parish and the need for a temporary solution in the interim.

Regarding the first need, in the coming months we will interview professional architecture firms that specialize in master planning and contract one to assist us in orchestrating a sound future for our parish, similar to the process used in our building renovation and the construction of Hardebeck Hall in 1994 and 1995.

Meanwhile, after prayerful consideration of several proposed temporary solutions, God has answered our prayers through the generosity of the Tippecanoe School Corporation, which has donated four modular buildings for our use, bringing a total of an additional 5,500 square feet of classroom space. These buildings, for which we will only incur moving and set-up costs, will soon be placed in the rear parking lot, where they will help alleviate some of the classroom space pressure while we get a permanent solution in place.

Although the buildings themselves have been donated, the moving and set-up costs are not negligible. We are hoping that you believe as much as we do that a comfortable learning environment for our young people is an important factor in building the future of the Church, and that you will help support this endeavor through prayerful stewardship.

Growth is a good sign. It is a sign of life. Like the seed that has been planted in fertile ground, our parish is blossoming. I'm very excited to see what comes next.

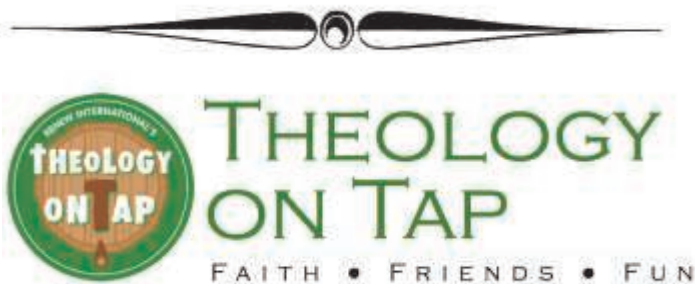
